

Oxford-University United Methodist Church and St. Peter's Episcopal Church will celebrate the **Feast Day of John and Charles Wesley** with a joint service beginning at 5:30 p.m. and then proceed to the sanctuary at OUUMC on Thursday, March 3.

The Right Reverend Duncan M. Gray III, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Mississippi, and the Reverend Hope Morgan Ward, Bishop of the Mississippi Conference of the United Methodist Church, will lead the Feast Day service in Oxford. Bishop Gray will preach and Bishop Ward will preside over the table for the service of Holy Communion.

In 2009, Bishop Gray and Bishop Ward signed a Covenant of Common Life, acknowledging the shared history of the two denominations and promoting the common ministries and mis-


sions of one another. One part of the Covenant is an annual celebration of the Eucharist with the Episcopal and United Methodist bishops presiding on the Feast Day of John and Charles Wesley. The Wesley brothers, 18th century ministers in the Church of England, helped spiritually renew the Church and the land. Both are greatly respected for

The official joint service of Holy Communion takes place in a different community every year. Ministers at both St. Peter's and OUUMC are excited for the opportunity to worship together, and look forward to a continued partnership in the future.

their invaluable contributions to both Episcopal and Methodist traditions.

"It is a joy to share with our Episcopal friends in celebration of the Feast Day of John and Charles Wesley," Warren Black, senior minister at OUUMC said. "As we come together for the Eucharist, we are reminded of our unity in Christ and the historic ties that bind us."

and Lucy is a retired teacher and pharmaceutical sales representative. They have three grown children and four grand-






Fifth Annual Shrove **Tuesday** Celebration Tuesday, March 8,


