

#### **Bahamas-Methodist Habitat Mission Trip**

With happy hearts and much excitement and anticipation, 15 O-U members set out for a week's work on Eleuthera Island, Bahamas. The Mission Team included Ashley and David Allen, Callie Casteel, Lauren Childress, Timeka and Josh Davis, Claire Dobbs, Lynn Etheridge, Pat Gillenwater, Clara Kinney, Ellen Lackey, Russ McLellan, Jean Shaw, Warren Smith, and Julie Wilson. We traveled and worked under the auspices of UMVIM (United Methodist Volunteers in Mission).

With the help of Bahamas Methodist Habitat's dedicated staff, we were able to:

- Repair two storm-damaged roofs
- Build scaffolding and complete siding and trim on a two-story home
- Build a bathroom vanity (from scratch!), frame a shower, install concrete backer board and concrete shower floor
- Jack-hammer and dig a 4 x 10 x 6 foot pit as well as a shallow pit for a septic tank
- Frame out kitchen cabinets (again from scratch!)
- Install concrete backer boards and ceilings for a second bathroom and hallway
- Finish roofing the two-story home.

Each day, we used power tools and completed tasks that many of us had never done before; we found we could accomplish more than we had previously imagined.

After each 7-hour workday, we waded, swam, and snorkeled in four different locations in the Atlantic Ocean and Caribbean Sea. Daily devotions, prayers, a touching foot-washing service (See John 13), and communion kept us centered, inspired us, and fostered our sense of gratitude for all that we have — and that we could share our energy and talents with others. We cared for each other and built friendships that may not have occurred in ordinary circumstances.

On the final day we enjoyed a "Jeep safari" island tour including snorkeling, lunch in City Park, Preacher's Cave, the Glass Bridge, and Queen's Bath pools.

The mission team thanks the congregation for its prayers, good wishes, and tangible support. We were proud to represent OUUMC in this endeavor.
